Abstract

The purpose of this research is to show the grotesque elements of the cursed works of the moon and scorpion of the wind by Nazanin Jodet, Jannameh and my small prayer room by Hoshang Golshiri, the time of guilt and fearlessness by Mohammad Reza Katib. This research was done by analytical-descriptive method and based on library notes. The results indicate that the component of fear was the most prominent in the works of all three authors In addition to this, Nazanin Judet has the components of horror, fear and loneliness, creating atmosphere and atmosphere, contradiction and ambiguity, unusual physical characteristics, disgusting and violent themes and the use of women as a tool.
